Good News for 2015 National Intercollegiate Athletic Games

The Opening Ceremony of the 2015 National Intercollegiate Athletic Games took place at Fu Jen on May 2. The National Intercollegiate Athletic Games is an important annual event for student athletes in Taiwan. The Ministry of Education (MOE) commissioned Fu Jen Catholic University to host the 2015 National Intercollegiate Athletic Games. This is a rare honor and precedent for private universities. Fu Jen has been honored to hold the National Intercollegiate Athletic Games twice since 1983.

Over 13,000 student athletes from different colleges in Taiwan participated in Games 2015. The event not only marked the 45th anniversary of the National Intercollegiate Athletic Games, but also an important milestone for every member in the Fu Jen community. The MOE Sports Administration not only provides abundant awards for medal-winners, but also permits participants with the most potential to advance in competition for national recognition. “A student on the Fu Jen swimming team, Yu-Lian Wang, broke the national record and 44 participants won recognition in Games 2015,” said President Vincent Han-Sun Chiang.

Games 2015 included swimming and tennis, just to mention two areas. Po-Fang Huang, coach of the university team, stressed that the university team will faithfully finish every tough workout in addition to enhancing advanced skills. “Our participation in Games 2015 was rewarding, because we earned 16 gold, 12 silver, and 23 bronze medals. Our team will continue to develop an effective strategy for student athletes. In addition to intensive training for Universiade Taipei 2017, we also adopt scientific methods and keep a careful eye on our students’ physical and mental health,” said Coach Huang.



Students Win Gold in 2015 World University Cheerleading Championship

FJCU students won a gold medal in the 2015 World University Cheerleading Championship in the United States on January 20. The International Cheer Union (ICU) acknowledged the superior performance of Chia-Ni Tu and Ting-Yun Hu, two senior students in the Physical Education Department, in the Freestyle Pom Doubles Competition. This was the second gold medal for Taiwan in the ICU.

The two young women won the gold last year and continued to triumph in January, 2015. Ming-Yun Guo, cheerleading coach in the PE Department, expressed her delight at hearing of the gold medal. She added that although Tu and Hu had won championships in the National Cheerleading Championship four times in Taiwan, both students soared higher than her expectations in 2015. On behalf of the school cheerleading team, Ming-Yun Guo offered special thanks for support from the Chinese Taipei Cheerleading Association (CTCA). “Without the strong helping hand of the CTCA, nothing would have gone smoothly,” said Guo.

Chia-Ni Tu and Ting-Yun Hu told *Fu Jen Life* that the criteria of the ICU score sheet focused on performance techniques. Thus it took them added effort and much time to polish their dance. They felt that their rapport with each other was excellent, because of years of collaboration in improving their dancing skills. As for details about choreography and costume selection, they always seemed to come up with similar ideas.

Professor Jung-Lung Chen, Vice-President of FJCU said to *Fu Jen Life* that he particularly felt proud of their accomplishment. He added that since cheerleading competition has always been a tradition at Fu Jen, “Chia-Ni Tu and Ting-Yun Hu set a superior example for every student.”



Music Department Receives Accreditation from Steinberg Certified Training Center

The Fu Jen Catholic University College of Arts and Music Department has received accreditation from the Steinberg Certified Training Center to become the first Cubase and Nuendo Electronic Music Certification Center in Taiwan.

The Fu Jen Catholic University Music Department is the leader in this highly technical field and is the first to establish an undergraduate, graduate, and continuing

education Master's program in Applied Music with a section devoted to electronic music. In 1988 we opened the first electronic music laboratory of its kind among Taiwan universities, and now, after many years of commitment and hard work, we are proud to announce that our long-term objective of becoming a Steinberg Certified Training Center was achieved in April 2015. This now opens fantastic opportunities for all prospective students interested in passing the certification examinations for obtaining a Cubase or Nuendo software license. The certification process will begin June 2015.

90th Anniversary of FJCU: 90 Years of Blessing

Fu Jen Chaplain Rev. John Shou-Chung Lai spoke at the first session of the Catholic Lecture Series and introduced the history of FJCU to the new members of Fu Jen on March 19, 2015.

In 1925, Fu Jen University was founded in Beijing by the Benedictines of St. Vincent Archabbey of Latrobe

Pennsylvania, USA under the name Fu Jen Academy. In 1929, the university already consisted of three colleges. In 1933, the administration of the university was transferred from the Benedictines to the Society of the Divine Word (SVD). In 1961, Fu Jen was re-located in Taiwan. FJCU has been under the auspices of the joint administration of the Chinese Diocesan Clergy, the Society of the Divine Word, the Sisters of the Holy Spirit and the Society of Jesus after the relocation. President Vincent Han-Sun Chiang and the Chaplain hope to help everyone to better understand the history of the university and relevant Catholic teachings.

Eduniversal Ranking Notes Fu Jen College of Management as the Best Private Business School

The 2015 Eduniversal Best Business School Ranking has ranked the Fu Jen College of Management as the best private business school in Taiwan, and among the top 3 in the country. Eduniversal, which was founded in 1994, is a college ranking organized by the French consulting firm known as SMBG. One of its missions is to offer a precise evaluative reference for students around the world. An International Scientific Committee that consists of 12 members provides the official selection every year. The list reflects the degree of internationalization of every individual university and college. The official selection is published by the International Scientific Committee in its annual report. Its website announces the result of the “Deans Vote”.

Chau-Chiun Lin, a staff member of the College of Management, commented that the achievement in Eduniversal will boost the spirit of the team. He added that

since the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) recognizes Fu Jen’s effort in enhancing internationalization, the AACSB currently approves FJCU’s application for the renewal of accreditation. In addition, the College serves as a member of the International Association of Jesuit Business Schools (IAJBS). Both the AACSB accreditation and its IAJBS membership are highly desirable for the Fu Jen College of Management. “The achievement in the Eduniversal Ranking encourages more international students to decide to apply for advanced study at FJCU,” said Professor Michael Tian-Shyug Lee, Dean of the College of Management.

For the sake of the aging society and low birth rate problem in Taiwan, Dean Lee stressed that the College of Management has prepared a campaign for financial assistance in addition to scholarships, featured international programs such as EMBA, and “the Bridge” programs with renowned universities in China, Europe and the United States of America. Dean Lee announced that both the University of Notre Dame and Georgetown University have recently expressed positive views toward more intensive cooperation with Fu Jen. The Dean said to *Fu Jen Life* that he truly appreciated the efforts of the staff and faculty members.



AART Alumni Win Silver Medal in Taiwan International Design Competition

A work of AART design team “觀世音” (in Chinese, guanshiyin) recently won a silver medal in the Taiwan International Design Competition. The Taiwan International Design Competition, held by the Industrial Development Bureau in the Ministry of Economic Affairs, is an important

annual design competition in Taiwan. The Industrial Development Bureau offers abundant rewards to encourage prize-winners. Only 28 out of 2681 submissions were selected in the finale this year. The name list of the AART alumni designers included Jia-Rong Lin, Jian-Cyun Yu and Shang-Ting Chou, who recently graduated from FJCU.

The theme of “觀世音” is to promote sign language with special artistic effects. Jian-Cyun considered the Buddhist art in the Dunhuang Caves (in Chinese, “敦煌莫高窟”) to be the source of inspiration. According to the teaching of Buddhism, “guanshiyin,” who embodies Buddhist compassion, strives to save those in need with thousands of helping hands. Jia-Rong Lin commented that traditional sign-language books are too informative to be comprehensible. “In other words, we aspire to help people to learn sign language with more reader-orientated materials. Thus, we composed “觀世音” with intensive attention and care,” explained Jia-Rong Lin. “It was a great pity that contenders from the People’s Republic of China won the gold and bronze. Somehow, we will continue to excel and improve our profession,” said Jia-Rong Lin.

Ministry of Education Confers Award Upon Prof. Yi-Ju Tsai

The Ministry of Education (MOE) recently conferred an important award upon Professor Yi-Ju Tsai, Director of the Fu Jen Faculty Development Center in the College of Medicine, in recognition of her efforts in promoting life education at Fu Jen Catholic University. In addition to teaching, Director Tsai provides a special course for life education for medical students. Every semester, she leads her students to attend a prayer ceremony which commemorates the generosity of the body donors in the donation program.

A freshman told *Fu Jen Life*, “I found Professor Tsai’s courses quite meaningful, because they reminded me how a vulnerable human being is and how valuable life can be.” Director Tsai stressed that participants will have a chance to express their gratitude and condolences to the donors’ family members. Professor Yi-Ju Tsai added that the programme respects the religious orientation of every individual donor and thus provides decent care to the deceased. She particularly requires her students to write a thank-you letter. “Students could not practice their professional knowledge without the donors’ devotion,” said the Professor. A sophomore said, “When we went to the funeral of an individual donor whose service has come to an end, we couldn’t help but pour out tears for the kindness of our silent teachers.”

2015 APRCSL Successfully Held in Taiwan

The 5th Asia-Pacific Regional Conference on Service-Learning (APRCSL) was successfully held at Fu Jen Catholic University from May 27 to 29, 2015. The conference on the theme, “Love Journey: Community Engagement through Service-Learning,” attracted more than 350 participants from 18 different countries, including scholars, experts, institution representatives, students and volunteers around the world to attend.

Professor Joseph A. Erickson from the U.S. and Dr. Peter A. Zervakis from Germany gave keynote speeches on “Educating in the Digital Age: Why Service-Learning Is More Important Now Than Ever” and “Service-Learning at German and European Higher Education Institutions: Some Observations of New Phenomenon.” In addition, the conference included a president’s forum on “How Can Universities Respond to Needs of the Society?—From Service-Learning to Community Engagement in the Global Village,” thematic presentations, group panels, interactive workshops, and poster presentations with a total of 140 papers presented. Participants were given plenty of opportunities to reflect on the value and efficacy of service-learning and share fruits of their work.

The Asia-Pacific Regional Conference on Service-Learning (APRCSL) was a biennial event initiated by Lingnan University in 2007. The Conference at Fu Jen was the first time for this professional gathering to take place outside of Hong Kong. The next APRCSL Conference will be held at Petra Christian University, Indonesia in 2017.

Special Report about the College of Foreign Languages

The Fu Jen College of Foreign Languages offers undergraduate and graduate (M.A.) programs in English, German, French, Spanish, and Japanese. It also includes a B.A. program in Italian. The College consists of six departments and a graduate institute. The Fu Jen Graduate Institute of Cross-Cultural Studies concentrates on the exploration of comparative literature, linguistics, and the development of professionals in translation and interpretation studies.

The College's six affiliated programs include the Program in Diplomacy and International Affairs, the Program in International Medical Translation, the Program in Western Classical and Medieval Culture, the English Elite Program, the Program in Teaching Chinese as a Second Language, and the Program in Financial, Economic and Legal Translation. The College has also established the Foreign Language Teaching Resource Center and the Center for Japan Studies to enhance the quality of its research.

In addition, in the spirit of Catholic beliefs, the College of Foreign Languages always keeps a careful eye on the improvement of social welfare in Taiwan. Every year, the authorities strongly encourage students to participate in various service-learning programs at Fu Jen. For an example, the English Department continues to recruit students to join the English Teaching Project for Chang Fu Elementary School (in Chinese, “長福國小英語志工服務隊暑期英語營”) every summer and winter. The College of Foreign Languages insists on the fulfillment of its education philosophy, which particularly involves its “life education” model. Thus, the College


considers that these experiences can improve cultural sensitivity of students.

National Award for Arts Conferred Upon Alumnus of English Department



The 18th National Award for Arts has been conferred upon renowned scene designer Austin Wang (王孟超), a graduate of the English Department at Fu Jen, and five other excellent artists in Taiwan. The National Award for Arts is the highest honor for artists in Taiwan. The award ceremony took place at Taipei Zhongshan Hall. President Ying-Jeou Ma attended the ceremony

with Minister of Culture Ying-Tai Lung and two hundred honored guests from different fields. The President presented the awards to the winners and expressed his admiration for their achievements.

Every year the National Culture and Arts Foundation (NCAF), which was founded in 1996, recognizes important art events and rewards the devotion of artists involved in literature, visual arts, music, dance, traditional and contemporary theater, and cultural heritage preservation. The NCAF offers scholarships, grants, and professional counseling for gifted individuals and various non-profit organizations. According to the NCAF financial statement, funding of the institute is up to NT\$6 billion. To improve the cultural industry, authorities aspire to establish a grant campaign to collect an additional 4 billion dollars.

Stan Shih, founder of the Acer International Corporation, and chair of the National Culture and Arts Foundation, presided over the award ceremony. "This meaningful event marks the 18th year of the National Award for Arts. So far the NCAF has given the award to 92 winners who have devoted their lives to the overall development of the creative industry and related fields," said the Chair. Stan Shih expressed his appreciation for the accomplishments of these role models. He added that the NCAF always hopes to help art masters to promote their artistic philosophy and the profile of Taiwan among its diplomatic allies.

Upon receiving the Award, the scenographer Wang expressed his delight. He once assisted the Cloud Gate Dance Theatre in its Cloud Gate Series, with performances such as "Songs of the Wanderers (流浪者之歌)," "Moon Water (水月)" and "Cursive II (行草二)." In addition, Wang also has designed scenes for the famous drama "the Peony Pavilion (青春版牡丹亭)" and continues to collaborate with a variety of artists in Taiwan. At the end of the ceremony, the Executive Director of Cloud Gate Dance Foundation Wen-Wen Yeh spoke as an honored guest, and offered her congratulations.



"機車海" (in English, "Overwhelming Motor") focuses on the social phenomenon of overachievement stress. Yu-Lin Chen explained that the cats, which symbolize the perseverance of common people, welcome every new day with a warm smile regardless of an encounter with various challenges. The other three works of art, "野狼上街" (Courier), "三貼" (Family tour) and "貓稻田" (Rice field) illustrate different stages of family life. 
